## **International Students**

On arrival international pupils will be taken to the school uniform supplier to purchase school uniform. Alternatively, this can be preordered from the website and delivered to school. Alterations and changes can be easily made on arrival.

## **Pocket Money**

Pupils are not allowed to carry or hold large amounts of money at any time, but they are responsible for any sum that they carry or hold. Money can be banked with the school office at the start of every term or through the Houseparent at any time. Pupils are allowed to withdraw a maximum of £10 per bank day. If they require additional money, they should ask their houseparent for a bank slip which authorises a larger sum. It is the responsibility of the parent/guardian to fix and notify the houseparent of any restrictions on pocket money withdrawal. Pupils requiring weekend pocket money should request this through the houseparent before breakfast on Friday and it is issued at intervals during the weekend. Again, any restrictions must come from parents/guardians. Weekly boarders may request pocket money on Friday, and it is issued before they leave at 5.00 p.m.

## **Electronic Devices**

Please feel free to bring along electronic devices such as mobile phones, laptops, tablets and smart speakers as well as a set of headphones, earphones and Airpods to listen to your favourite music without disturbing the rest of the house. All devices will be collected in by house parents at night.
