

Message from our Catering Department

We have attached an updated menu having sought feedback on the term so far. One change you will have noticed is that fish and chip Friday has returned! As with many catering settings, we have been facing significant challenges with our supply chain and this is why there have been some occasions when variations to the published menu have been forced upon us. We continue to work hard with our suppliers to improve this situation.

As you will also be aware inflation is causing a significant increase in prices and this is having a significant impact on us as a school. Having kept prices the same since 2016, there has been an enforced price rise since September, with a meal now costing £2.90. This explains why there has been a slight difference in cost on the school gateway which some parents have raised with us. We apologise for not formally notifying parents on the newsletter regarding this. We are constantly speaking to suppliers to reduce costs to parents wherever possible. Of course, for children in Reception, year 1 and Year 2 the school meals to continue to be free of charge




Playleaders Tuesday 1st November
