

Thank you for your feedback and support.



Did you know that it has been a legal requirement to wear a seat belt since 1983. Not wearing a seat belt is against the law and could be punishable by a fine of up to £500. Since the law was changed in 1983, it is estimated that wearing seat belts in cars has saved 50 million lives, that's close to the entire population of England!
