On Thursday evening we were treated to a superb Christingle service for parents and friends of Year 6 where the elements of the Christingle were identified to demonstrate the importance to Christians of this time of the year.



The orange represents the earth on which we all live alongside each other, the red bow the blood shed by Jesus for us all, the sweets are the fruit, food and resources that God has given us, the four cocktail stick to represent north, east, south and west and finally the candle is the light that God created to lift us all out of darkness. The pupils and congregation sang hymns and seasonal songs, and narrators explained the importance of the season and Christingle. It was moving and marvellous, well done everyone involved.




At the end of that service, we also took the time to reflect that it is sadly the final service that Mr Mark Mitchell, Head of the Royal Primary School will share with us before he leaves to take on a large primary school in Solihull. Mr Mitchell arrived at easter in 2016 at the time when we converted from a small independent school to now a thriving three form entry primary school that we have now. As he arrived, we had a great deal of scrutiny by the Department of Education and ESFA which Mark threw himself into and he helped ensure we had all 'green lights' as we opened in September 2016. I am indebted to Mr Mitchell for supporting me in those early days and being able to oversee the development of the primary phase so impressively.

That the primary school is the most oversubscribed primary in the West Midlands and part of our all-through school which is the most oversubscribed in England is in no small part due to Mr Mitchell's vision and dedication. We learned recently that official data indicates that the Key Stage 2 outcomes for pupils in the summer of 2022 were 'significantly above national figures' and in the top 20% of all schools nationally which is the highest grade possible. That is in all elements, reading, writing, maths, and SPAG which is incredible testament to our pupils, you as families, our teachers and teaching assistants and especially to Mr Mitchell's leadership throughout. I am delighted that our 'creative and exciting' curriculum of Cornerstones and our exceptional enrichment programme after school and within the curriculum has produced such impressive outcomes. The proportion of high attaining pupils who achieved the highest outcomes is significantly above national figures too and that rigour and depth is a direct result of teachers being well led, supported, and challenged to offer the very best opportunity for our pupils.

You will also be aware of Mr Mitchell whether you are in the primary or secondary school, boarding setting, or a parent as he has been an ever-present character during those 6 and half years. You will remember the drum solos at the Festival of Light in November, drumming in the primary hall and his encouragement of pupils to take an interest in music, the performing arts and wider school life. A new skill developed for Mr Mitchell during lockdown where he became a YouTube star with assemblies, weekly newsletters and continued to engage with all pupils, families, and staff during a difficult period for us all. We remained open as a school to vulnerable young people throughout the period with more than 250 children on site each day and Mr Mitchell contributed to positive attitudes to learning wherever people were during the pandemic.

We are all very sorry to see Mr Mitchell uproot and move back to Solihull where he came from to join us, and we all wish him well for the future. Those children who have been in the school during his stewardship of the primary phase will, in future years, look back on the time between 2016 and 2023 and consider it one of the 'golden phases' of life at the Royal. However, knowing Mark as I do, he will want that quality not only continue but continue to evolve, diversify and blossom under Mrs Jefferson's leadership which he has helped foster as a smooth transition and succession. That is the quality of the man who has ensured the legacy of excellence at the Royal Primary school is destined to continue into the future and our distinctive character that he understood from interview is likely to continue successfully. He will of course always remain part of the 'Royal School Family' and I am sure you will welcome him warmly on any visit.


