

Message from Swimming Department

#### **Swimming Caps**

If you child's hair is longer than shoulder length a swimming cap must be worn for swimming. Caps are available to purchase through our swimming department at a cost of £3.00. Should you wish to purchase, please make payment via the gateway.

### **Ringworm & Swimming**

If a child with ringworm has received at least 72 hours of the appropriate antifungal treatment, they may swim.

Any student with suspected or confirmed ringworm who has not received at least 72 hours of appropriate treatment will not be permitted to swim.



Chinese New Year, also called Lunar New Year, is an annual 15-day festival in China and Chinese communities around the world that begins with the new moon that occurs sometime between January 21 and February 20 according to Western calendars. Festivities last until the following full moon. 2023 is the Year of the Water Rabbit following the Chinese calendar, which rotates in 60-year cycles based on 12 earthly branches, each represented by an animal year, and five heavenly stems — wood, fire, earth, metal, and water.
