I hope this message finds you well. I'd like to address a matter of growing concern at our school regarding lost property. We understand that it can be frustrating when your child misplaces their belongings, but we have noticed an increasing number of parents asking teachers and reception staff to search for lost items at the end of the school day. This is placing unmanageable pressure on our staff, whose time is already committed to running clubs and organising activities with children or attending meetings during these hours.

We want to emphasise the importance of naming your child's property. When items are clearly labelled, they often find their way back to the rightful owners within a few days. Additionally, children can check the lost property area during the school day if they've misplaced something. Naming belongings not only helps us return lost items but also teaches our children responsibility for their own possessions, which is a valuable lesson.

In light of the increasing demands on our staff and to reduce crowding in the Reception area, we have decided to implement the following changes, effective from Monday, October 16th 2023

- Please could we ask that parents avoid entering the school premises to inquire about lost property. This is to ensure that staff can focus on their after-school activities with the children.
- Teaching staff will not be able to visit the lost property area after school, as they will be occupied
 with clubs and activities. We trust that you understand the importance of these activities in your
 child's development.
- Instead, we will make sure that lost property, when returned to us, is delivered to the respective classes. Children will have the opportunity to check for their lost items during break and lunch times.
- We want to reassure you that named lost property is always eventually returned. We believe that
 these changes will help streamline the process and alleviate the pressure on our staff. We
 appreciate your understanding and encourage you to label your child's belongings to facilitate a
 smoother return of lost items.





