



He spoke to us about preparing for Christmas not just through buying present, but by preparing ourselves and trying to change bad habits into good habits.




Snowflake the Elf came from the North Pole and landed in Year 1 today. Snowflake clearly brought along with him the cold weather and a letter from Santa for the children.


We are thrilled to share some exciting news with you – our much-anticipated outdoor classroom has been delivered and is ready for action!
