Dear Parents and Carers,

We would like to take this opportunity to say how incredibly proud we are of the children and the positive way they have responded to our Good to Be Green behaviour pathway. As you know, each week pupils who do not receive a red card that week are rewarded with additional playtime on a Friday. In addition to this, each half term we aim to hold a larger reward event for those children who have not received a red card throughout the entire half term.

Last half term, children who achieved their Good to Be Green reward enjoyed a classroom cinema experience complete with popcorn! This half term, we are excited to offer a super special reward.

On Tuesday 10th February, for our Good to Be Green reward, we will be welcoming an amazing visiting storyteller, Peter Chand. Peter will be running storytelling workshops across the school. Children who do not incur a red card during this half term will be invited to attend these exciting storytelling sessions.

There is a small cost of £1.20 for pupils to take part. This will contribute towards the cost of the storyteller, and any additional funds raised will be used to provide resources that promote oracy within our OPAL provision, encouraging storytelling and imaginative play outdoors.

If you would like your child to participate, please make the £1.20 payment via School Gateway by 31st January. Children who do not wish to participate will remain in their classroom and take part in a planned alternative activity.

Any pupils who have received a red card and are therefore unable to access this additional reward will take part in restorative work with a member of the leadership team while the rest of their class attends the activity.
